MESSAGE FROMTHE CHAIRMAN - 2019...

Happy New Year to you all. The 2018 season seems to have come and gone so quickly. In the early part of the season the lough produced some fantastic fishing with a lot of anglers reporting double figure catches on almost every method. Both shore and boat anglers enjoying the benefits of the new rule change introduced for the 2018 season. We envisage this to continue for the foreseeable future and we trust our members will continue to abide by them.

The fishing on the lough fell away in the middle of the season again due to poor fishing weather. It is worth noting that several other lakes had to close due to algae blooms. The muddy brown condition of the water in the lake continues. This is very fine sediment suspended in the water column. This did not seem to reduce the fishing a great deal but did help reducing the algae bloom and almost a weed free lough. As the season progressed the fishing again improved with the small brown trout showing exceptional growth in the short time they have been in the lough.

The committee have instructed our supplier that we will continue the same monitory value of £20,000 for the 2019 season. It would be our intention to carry this programme forward with the same expenditure on small brown trout. After a few seasons we may be able to look at allowing brown trout to be part of the bag limit.

Our boat lodge attendants Andy and Darrel again have shown themselves to be excellent employees for the club. On behalf on the club and visiting anglers I would like to thank them for the superb efforts.

Through 2018 the committee have continued to deal with the day to day running of the club as well as dealing with other unexpected issues. One of those was the introduction of the "Data Protection Act". I would like to thank Brendan Downey for battling his way through the mass off literature and compiling a document for the club's use. The club required a data protection officer and Robert Weir has agreed to take on this role. I would like to thank them both for their work in this.

For our members in short it will consist of them being asked for consent for the club to hold the small amount of information we have on our members. Allowing our news sheet to be sent out etc. The

document has been loaded onto the club's web site.

Along with my thanks to every member of the committee an extra word of thanks to S. Vage, E. Shannon, S. Grant, W. Clinghan, M. Dynes, D. McCullough, J. McCandless, H. McKnight, D. Murtagh and J. Curran. The extra work they carry out helps the club run as smoothly as possible. A special thank you to William Cochrane for the numerous duties he carries out on the club's behalf.

I would like to thank all our Riparian owners, Club Sponsors, The Anglers Rest, the ABC Council for their support over the year and hope that it may continue.

As you may be aware of the closure of Coburns Shop, on behalf of the Club I would like to thank them for their support over the years. They will be missed. I am glad to learn that Coburn's have acknowledged William's many years of service.

The river was also badly affected by the weather through 2018. Some lovely trout were caught in the river. The rain was almost too late in the season to allow a good run of salmon but again some were caught and returned safely. The predation of the fish in the river is having a dramatic effect, but the one thing we have learnt is how quickly the river can recover if given the chance. As always, we will be pushing this issue as hard as we can.

Congratulations to those members who participated in the club competitions of all age groups and the few inter club competitions which have developed. It is great to see the enjoyment on the faces of our younger members particularly at the prize day on the lough. Thanks to everyone involved.

The committee have been notified of some bereavement through the year and I would like to offer our sincere condolences to their families.

I would like to point out that the collection of fees will be either by post or at the club rooms.

I would like wish everyone tight lines for the 2019 season. Best Wishes.

I am sure that by now most of you will be aware of the closure of Coburns Fishing Tackle outlet, Scarva Street, Banbridge. This was a province wide known tackle shop serving not only the local angling, shooting and country sports community but those also from all corners of the province and much further afield with like-minded interests.

Coburns to anglers, shooters and gardners certainly within the local area was a household name providing for many years' quality angling equipment, fly tying materials, shooting and gardening supplies. Aside from this it was a place to meet and chat with fellow enthusiasts on all aspects of angling never mind the usual banter, tall stories including 'the one that got away', secret flies and sometimes the outrageous yarns that left you just wondering, what next!

The shop was managed for many years by the late Dominic Downey and in more recent years by William Cochrane who I believe in total has served the country sports community from Coburns array of counters for over 35 years.

With the closure this has most certainly left a void in the supply chain of equipment, materials and advice to anglers and for Banbridge Angling Club a great loss in its source of connection with its members and future members as Coburns provided a hugh amount of support to the Club for many years with a lot of the Club's business facilitated

through collection of membership fees, Day Ticket sales, new member contacts to mention but a few of the services provided.

The outlet will be greatly missed by all and we wish William, Rodger and Stevie all the very best in gaining new employment in the near future.

COLLECTION OF CLUB FEES

GDPR forms not returned may mean that the member's contact information will be deleted leading to important information not reaching the member.

Please note the Club will not share any contact or other information held on file about member's with third parties.

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATIONS - (GDPR)

It is now the law that all organisations demonstrate that they work in compliance with the current General Data Protection Regulations which in general terms means that our Club needs your permission to hold and store any information it has relating to your membership with Banbridge Angling Club. This for most within the Club is holding your name and address on file to allow the club to keep in contact with you.

To this end the Club has produced a General Data Protection consent form for completion by each member. This form is included within your News Sheet and needs to be fully completed and returned with your Club fees for the incoming season.

Failure to provide or if you decline to provide this consent you may not receive important notifications with regard to the Club's business and activities in the future and this may jeopardise your membership.

The Committee would therefore ask you to support the Club in meeting compliance, and help keep the work load to a minimum by returning this form during the collection of the fees period. Thankyou.

I would like to pay special thanks to Brendan Downey who has taken on the responsibility of steering the Club through the set up of this now mandatory compliance on Data Protection Regulations ensuring our Club does not fall foul in this respect. This now requires the additional role of a Data Protection Officer (DPO) to be filled.

Again many thanks for your hard work on this matter Brendan.

ULSTER ANGLING FEDERATION WORK

As most of our members know our Club is affiliated to the Ulster Angling Federation an organisation that play's a critical role in salmon and trout conservation since its inception over seventy years ago. The Federation are continuously encouraged and grateful for the interest and dedication of their members and it is Club support that allows them to maintain their lobbying, education, advocacy and conservation work. Working together, they strive to look after our fisheries for the benefit of our members and for future generations.

For your information the following is a short extract from the Federation Chairman's annual report detailing the typical work the Federation undertake's on behalf of affiliated Angling Club's in Northern Ireland.

"This is just a short sample of the work we typically carry out, to illustrate for members the extent of the effort being made on behalf of anglers by the Ulster Angling Federation.

In the last year we have attended numerous meetings and also represented the Federation's interest on many Committees including; NI Angling Forum, N I Environment Link, Water Framework Stakeholders Committee, North Atlantic Salmon Fund (NI), Fresh Water Task Force, Loughs Agency Advisory Forum, DAERA Salmon and Inland Fisheries Advisory Forum, Countryside Alliance Ireland, Partnership for Action Against Wildlife Crime (PAW) Poaching Group, various Water Framework Directive Catchment Stakeholder Groups and of course visiting and working with member clubs. This year we have initiated a number of coaching qualification courses.



We have prepared many Federation letters and responses to numerous Government consultation papers, various road schemes, and a large number of planning objections. During the year the Federation attended the Game Fair at Shane's Castle. On average our Development Officer and Federation Officers personally send and answered some 600 e-mails each month. In an effort to keep our members informed our Development Officer produces a monthly Newsletter which gives an understanding of the issues being tackled by the Federation. Our monthly Newsletters are available on our website. In addition, the Angling Active Clubs Co-ordinator Gary Houston works full time for the governing bodies of Angling in Northern Ireland, The Ulster Angling Federation and the National Coarse Fishing Federation Ireland Ulster Branch, as supported by The Lottery, Sport NI and Outdoor Recreation NI. Gary also produces a monthly Newsletter.

In each year we will typically;

Attend 250 meetings.

Handle 120 items of outgoing correspondence.

Handle 250 items of incoming correspondence.

Make 15 submissions on Government Consultations

We are members of 12 Committees/Forums.

We generally send/receive very large numbers of other emails too numerous to list.

FRIENDSHIP CUP 2018



FIRST LEG

On Saturday 7 April the Club hosted the 1st leg of the Friendship Cup at Corbet Lough against our friends from the Armagh Angling Club. The Banbridge Club's Captain Martin Dynes was 'off his feet' at the time and was unavailable for selection. The conditions at the Corbet were very good with a bit of heat in the air and a nice corduroy ripple on the Lough. The fishing was first class with anglers catching regularly throughout the day. At lunchtime Wilson Clinghan and Malachy McAleenan had their bag limits and the word from around the Lough was that Sam Grant had a great fish. At the weigh-in Banbridge Angling Club had a total catch of 46lbs 15ozs with the Armagh Angling Club's total catch weighing 39lbs. Sam Grant weighed in the best fish of the day, a nice Rainbow of 3lbs 9ozs. Paul McKillen weighed in the Armagh Club's best fish another nice Rainbow of 3lbs 4ozs. The Banbridge Club has an advantage of 7lbs 15ozs for the 2nd leg which was fished on the Armagh Club's waters later in the season.

SECOND LEG

Armagh Angling Club hosted the 2nd leg of the Friendship Cup competition between Armagh Angling Club and Banbridge Angling Club at Seaghan Dam on Saturday 29 September 2018. The conditions on the day were bright and blustery and in addition the water levels at Seaghan Dam were quite low, which all resulted in the fishing being challenging. Armagh Angling Club, as always, give the Banbridge Team a warm welcome along with the usual competitive craic and banter as the anglers tackled up in preparation for the competition.

The Banbridge Team carried a lead of 7lbs 15ozs into the 2nd leg but both teams knew that with the size of the fish in Seaghan that this was no more than a couple of good fish. The competition started at 10am with everyone going to different parts of the Dam to try and find the best place for casting due to the blustery winds. Adrian McAnarney

was the first man in the Banbridge Team to be into a fish on his second cast and it was a keeper. Both teams were seen to be catching fish on a regular basis. Roger McClements, Banbridge was having great sport catching numbers of fish but unfortunately all of them were Brown Trout which didn't count in this competition. However he made up for this in the afternoon session. At the lunch break the competition was very close between the teams. The weather conditions continued to be challenging into the afternoon session.

Frank Kearney, Banbridge, who had a lovely fish in the morning session, bagged up shortly after lunch. Peter Smyth, Armagh also had a couple of lovely fish in the morning and he also bagged up in the afternoon session. David McCreedy, Banbridge and Paul Houlahan, Armagh also had nice fish to the net. Dessie Graham, Banbridge was soon into a fish during the afternoon session and was seen netting a couple with Roger McClements finally managing to connect with three nice Rainbows. Milne Jones, Banbridge had a nice fish in the bag and got absolutely smashed on a cracking fish. Adrian McAnarney caught a cracking fish giving him a lovely brace of fish. David McCreedy soon had another fish on the bank also giving him a lovely brace of fish. During the afternoon session the other anglers observed a large commotion close to where Dessie Graham was fishing (perhaps he's fallen in given the splash of water that was seen). However this was not the case and Dessie had connected with a cracking fish that fought him like a trojan. Dessie's net was too small to net it and he summoned fellow team member Sam Grant for assistance.

Sam knows all about landing big fish at Seaghan as he caught a great fish here during the 2017 competition. When Dessie's fish hit the scales it weighed 7lbs 13ozs. It was a beautiful bar of silver with a tail like a shovel.

Adrian McAnarney, Banbridge and Adian Donnelly, Armagh were the joint competition adjucators. When both teams bags were totaled up over the two legs, the Banbridge Team retained the Friendship Cup 2018 having caught a total weight of 68lbs 10ozs over the two legs compared to the Armagh Team's total weight of 49lbs 11ozs. Dessie Graham won the Banbridge Teams heaviest fish with that great Rainbow of 7lb 13ozs. The winner of the Armagh Teams heaviest fish went to Brendan McGuinness with a very good fish of 3lb. Frank Kearney won the Banbridge Teams heaviest bag with a weight of 3lbs 14ozs. Peter Smyth took the Armagh Teams heaviest bag with a weight of 2lbs 14ozs. Adrian McAnarney, Banbridge Team captain 2018 thanks all the Banbridge anglers that fished in both legs of this year's competition. He also thanked Coburns Tackle Shop, Banbridge who sponsored prizes.
